## Description of ASAM Criteria-A

### ASAM Criteria-(A) – *Step 1 in the ASAM Series*

A general overview of ASAM as well as instruction related to the proper utilization of ASAM criteria for appropriate patient placement, and guidance for utilizing ASAM criteria to determine the appropriate treatment of patients based upon their level of care. The emphasis here and throughout the ASAM training series will be the use of the ASAM Criteria as a tool for initial client placement and ongoing services at a given level of care. This training will also address the role of ASAM in medical necessity and treatment planning.

#### Learning Objectives:

1. List the six dimensions of multidimensional patient assessment
2. Explain how the five broad levels of care recommended by ASAM criteria reflect specific services that are available throughout California
3. Demonstrate ability to apply ASAM risk ratings to information gathered through multidimensional assessment.

## Description of ASAM Criteria-B

### ASAM Criteria-(B) – *Step 2 in the ASAM Series*

Integrated treatment planning and documentation required to support current level of care and transition to other levels of care.

The ASAM criteria are a set of criteria for providing outcome-oriented and results-based care in the treatment of addiction. They provide separate placement criteria for adolescents and adults to create comprehensive and individualized treatment plans to be used in service planning and treatment across all services and levels of care. With the approval of the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) Waiver, implementation of the ASAM criteria will become an integral part of system transformation in California. This interactive, skills-based training will begin with a brief overview of the ASAM criteria and a cross-walk between the levels of care articulated in the ASAM criteria and the levels of care defined by the DMC-ODS Waiver. Following this brief review, the presenter will focus the remaining portion of the training on a detailed review of the four progress note formats approved for use in clinical files by SAPC, which are: (1) SOAP (Subjective, Objective, Assessment, and Plan); (2) GIRP (Goals, Intervention, Response, and Plan); (3) SIRP (Situation, Intervention, Response, and Progress); and (4) BIRP (Behavior, Intervention, Response, and Plan), followed by instruction on how to develop a comprehensive, individualized treatment plan. Each focus group format will be reviewed in detail, and participants will have the opportunity to practice drafting progress notes through a series of case scenarios.

#### Learning Objectives:

1. Demonstrate ability to apply ASAM risk ratings to information gathered through multidimensional assessment

2. Demonstrate an ability to create an individualized treatment plan based upon the ASAM criteria and risk across the six dimensions of multidimensional patient assessment.
3. Use progress notes to demonstrate movement toward attainment of treatment plan goals

## Description of ASAM Criteria-C

### ASAM Criteria-(C) – *Step 3 in the ASAM Series*

Using the ASAM Criteria to Re-Assess Clients within the Context of the California Treatment System

This interactive training will provide an overview of the ASAM Criteria, Levels of Withdrawal Management and ASAM Levels of Care. Through the use of case examples, participants will be divided into two groups with the task of reassessing individual case studies and determining if the client is to remain in the same level of care or be stepped up or down, depending upon the outcome of the assessment across each of the six dimensions. Participants will present their case to the overall group, describe the re-assessment process, provide an overview of the risk rating for each dimension, and establish a level of care placement utilizing the ASAM Level of Care Determination Tool developed in Los Angeles County.

### Learning Objectives:

1. Review the ASAM Criteria and discuss the value of a multidimensional assessment.
2. Apply, through case study discussion, the use of ASAM Criteria to establish risk ratings for each case study across the 6 ASAM dimensions.
3. Explain how to determine an appropriate level of care based upon the risk ratings for each case study reviewed.
